How do I set up POP or IMAP E-mail on an Android Device?

- 1. From the home screen, tap **Applications** > **Settings** > **Accounts & sync** > **Add account** > **Manual setup**.
- 2. On the **Incoming settings** screen, in the **Protocol** drop-down menu, select **IMAP** or **POP3**. We suggest you select IMAP because it supports more features.
- 3. In the **Email address** and **Username** text boxes, enter your full e-mail address, for example tony@contoso.com, and then select **Next**. Your user name is the same as your e-mail address.
- 4. In the **Password** text box, enter your email password.
- 5. In the **IMAP server** or **POP3 server** text box, enter your IMAP or POP server name. (Settings above)

- 6. In the **Security type** drop-down menu and **Server port** text boxes, specify the POP or IMAP settings, and then tap **Next**. Your e-mail application will check your IMAP or POP settings.
- 7. On the **Outgoing server settings** screen, the **Login required** option should be selected for you, and the **Username** and **Password** text boxes should be filled in.
- 8. In the **SMTP server** text box, enter the SMTP server (above).
- 9. In the **Security type** drop down menu and **Server port** text box, specify the SMTP settings (above) and click **Next**.
- In the Account name, text box, enter a name your account (for example "Office 365 email" or "Work email"). In the Your name text box, enter the name you want displayed when you send email to others (for example "Tony Smith"), and then select Finish Setup.

How do I set up POP or IMAP e-mail on an iPhone?

- 1. Tap Settings > Mail, Contacts, Calendars > Add Account.
- 2. Tap **Other**.
- 3. In the **Name** box, enter your full name.
- 4. In the Address box, enter your full e-mail address (for example, tony@contoso.com).
- 5. In the **Password** box, enter your password, and then tap **Save**.
- 6. Tap either **IMAP** or **POP**. IMAP is recommended because it supports more features.
- 7. Under Incoming Mail Server, in the Host Name box, enter your incoming server name (above).
- 8. In the **User Name** box, enter your full e-mail address (for example, tony@contoso.com). In the **Password** box, enter your email password.
- 9. Under Outgoing Mail Server, in the Host Name box, enter your outgoing server name (above).
- 10. In the **User Name** box, enter your full e-mail address (for example, tony@contoso.com). In **Password**, enter your email password.
- 11. Tap **Save**.

How do I set up POP or IMAP E-mail on Windows Phone?

- 1. On Start, swipe left to the App list, select Settings, and then select email + accounts.
- 2. Select Add an account and select Other account.
- 3. Enter your e-mail address and password and select **Sign in**. Windows Phone will try to set up your e-mail account automatically. If setup completes successfully, skip to step 6.
- If you see the message "We couldn't find the settings for the account information you entered", make sure the e-mail address and password are correct, and then select **Try again**. If setup completes successfully, skip to step 6.
- 5. If your e-mail account can't be set up automatically, select **Advanced**, and then select **Internet** email.

You'll need to enter the following information:

- a. Account name: This is a descriptive name for your account.
- b. **Your name:** Type your name as you want it to appear when you send e-mail messages from your phone.
- c. Incoming email server: This is the incoming e-mail server for your account.
- d. **Account type:** This will be either POP3 or IMAP4.
- e. User name: This is your full e-mail address, for example, tony@contoso.com.
- f. **Password:** This is the password for your email account.
- g. **Outgoing (SMTP) email server:** This is the outgoing email server name.
- h. Select Advanced and select the boxes Require SSL for incoming email and Require SSL for outgoing email.
- 6. Select Sign in.
